## 2. COMPOSITION / INFORMATION ON INGREDIENTS

**Ingredients:** POLYETHER MODIFIED TRISILOXANE 5-15%  
CAS: 134180-76-0

## 3. HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION

**Main hazards:** Risk of serious damage to eyes. Harmful to aquatic organisms, may cause long-term adverse effects in the aquatic environment.

## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES (SYMPTOMS)

**Skin contact:** There may be irritation and redness at the site of contact.  
**Eye contact:** There may be pain and redness. The eyes may water profusely. There may be severe pain. The vision may become blurred. May cause permanent damage.  
**Ingestion:** There may be soreness and redness of the mouth and throat. Nausea and stomach pain may occur.  
**Inhalation:** There may be irritation of the throat with a feeling of tightness in the chest.

## 4. FIRST AID MEASURES (ACTION)

**Skin contact:** Remove all contaminated clothes and footwear immediately unless stuck to skin. Wash immediately with plenty of soap and water.  
**Eye contact:** Bathe the eye with running water for 15 minutes. Transfer to hospital for specialist examination.  
**Ingestion:** Wash out mouth with water. Do not induce vomiting. If conscious, give half a litre of water to drink immediately. Consult a doctor.  
**Inhalation:** Remove casualty from exposure ensuring one's own safety whilst doing so.

## 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

**Extinguishing media:** Suitable extinguishing media for the surrounding fire should be used. Use water spray to cool containers.  
**Exposure hazards:** In combustion emits toxic fumes.  
**Protection of fire-fighters:** Wear self-contained breathing apparatus. Wear protective clothing to prevent contact with skin and eyes.

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

**Personal precautions:** Mark out the contaminated area with signs and prevent access to unauthorised personnel. Do not attempt to take action without suitable protective clothing - see section 8 of SDS. Turn leaking containers leak-side up to prevent the escape of liquid.  
**Environmental precautions:** Do not discharge into drains or rivers. Contain the spillage using bunding.  
**Clean-up procedures:** Absorb into dry earth or sand. Transfer to a closable, labelled salvage container for disposal by an appropriate method.

## 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

**Handling requirements:** Avoid direct contact with the substance. Ensure there is sufficient ventilation of the area. Avoid the formation or spread of mists in the air.  
**Storage conditions:** Store in cool, well ventilated area. Keep container tightly closed.

## 8. EXPOSURE CONTROLS / PERSONAL PROTECTION

**Engineering measures:** Ensure there is sufficient ventilation of the area.  
**Respiratory protection:** Self-contained breathing apparatus must be available in case of emergency.  
**Hand protection:** Protective gloves.

**Skin protection:** Protective clothing.
